Fire in Rocky:

Finding Perspective in a Changing Climate

The year 2020 was challenging for Rocky Mountain National Park and nearby communities, not only because of the COVID-19 pandemic, but also because of the East Troublesome and Cameron Peak fires, the two largest in Colorado history. These two wildfires affected approximately 30,000 acres, or about 9 percent of the park, making 2020 one of the worst fire years since the park was established.

Rocky is no stranger to fires, and evidence of past fires can be found in most of the park's forested ecosystems. It is worth asking why last year's fires were so devastating and what might be the legacy of these burns on the park's plant communities and wildlife.

During the fall of 2020, 97 percent of Colorado was in severe to exceptional drought, and the year was the eighth warmest and second driest on record for the state. This was the continuation of a warming and drying trend that has been developing for decades, if not over the course of the last century. Summer monsoon flow typically carries moisture from the southwest to Colorado, but in 2020 the monsoon rains were practically nonexistent. The warmer and drier the climate, greater

is the demand by the atmosphere for evaporation, and the vegetation on the land becomes more flammable. These are some of the conditions that intensified the 2020 fire season.

A view of forest landscape that has been recently burned can be very disturbing. However, closer examination, especially over several seasons following the fire, can reveal some interesting patterns. In mountainous terrain, with ridges, valleys, networks of drainages, and often expanses of exposed bedrock, forest fires rarely burn uniformly. Burned areas can occur adjacent to relatively unscathed forest patches. In places where the fire is widespread, individual trees or groups of trees somehow survive.

Even where large expanses of vegetation have been consumed by the fire, there are often differences from place to place in fire intensity. Where the fire was hottest, organic material in the soil is consumed, the soil is effectively sterilized, and it could take years for revegetation to take place. In other areas, soils are left intact, along with viable root

Happy New Year! I have never been so happy to see a past year in the rearview mirror. 2020 was a year of terrible loss for our community, both from the pandemic and from the wildfires that ravaged the park and surrounding communities; looking forward is the name of the game.

Still, we do have things to celebrate from 2020 – YOUR love for RMNP has never been more apparent. During the last few months, Conservancy donors and members stepped up in remarkable ways to support the park, particularly though gifts to our newly established Fire Restoration Fund. This new fund is a critical effort that targeted to help the park recover from the historic devastation brought on by the recent wildfires.

And while the loss of historic structures, homes and buildings has been tremendous, we are grateful for the park's active fire mitigation program, and the hard work during the past few years that greatly reduced the fire's impact on Rocky's habitats and natural resources. It's heartening to know that Conservancy members and donors have also been volunteering in recent years to work alongside park staff to lessen fuel loads in the park.

Most notably, the impact of the fires on the gateway communities and ecosystems of the Kawuneeche Valley has been enormous, and the Conservancy pledges to continue its mission by helping to restore the environment and the area's recreational opportunities, and by boosting the economy of the west side as much as possible. To begin, the Conservancy is supporting a full re-vamp of the exhibits of the Kawuneeche Visitor Center, set to be installed in 2023. Already this spring, we've been working alongside our NPS partners to remodel the facility to meet the changing needs of visitors and locals alike. The Shadow Mountain Fire Lookout on the park's west side is also on the Conservancy's radar, and we supported early planning of the restoration of this historic structure last year. Perhaps one day visitors will again be able to stand on the deck and revel in the expansive views.

Come spring, I am most looking forward the wildflowers that will emerge from the ashes anew. I'm hoping that by the end of this year we will once again be able to gather in person and tell each other our stories of this past year, a time of great challenge and resilience.

Is the park planning a timed-entry permit system in 2021?

At this time, the park does not plan to implement the same type of timedentry permit system as was used in 2020 but will continue restrictions when necessary and may implement other pilot visitor management techniques if congestion and crowding warrants. The timed-entry permit system at Rocky was a temporary solution to aid in reopening the park last summer due to COVID-19, with the goal of limiting the numbers of people to 60 percent of regular visitation. The timed-entry permit system enabled park staff to more safely manage the pace and flow of visitor use throughout the day, reduce crowding, and provide an improved visitor experience in alignment within the park's safe operational capacity during these extraordinary times. The park will incorporate lessons learned from this year as we move forward with our visitor-use management planning efforts. — RMNP Information Officer Kyle Patterson

Why are bears not considered true hibernators? Bears spend the winter months in a state known as torpor, somewhat different from true hibernation. That is, they periodically arouse, perhaps to give birth, in response to disturbance, or to simply emerge and walk around a bit. Physiologically, although their metabolic functions are reduced by about 50% and body temperature drops from a normal 100°F to about 88°F, these are much smaller reductions than are seen in true hibernators, such as ground squirrels, chipmunks and marmots, whose body temperatures may approach freezing. — Retired RMNP Wildlife Biologist Gary Miller

Is the park planning any vegetation restoraton projects in any of the areas burned by the East Troublesome Fire? Fire

is a natural forest process, especially in the lodgepole pine and spruce/ fir forest communities that make up a large portion of Rocky Mountain National Park. These forest systems are well adapted to recover from fires like the ones Colorado experienced this fall. A hike through the forests of the 1978 Ouzel Fire is an example of how this recovery process could play out in the years to come. Two other vegetation types, wetlands and limber pine communities, have been stressed by other factors, such as past human use, previous natural disturbances, and seed dispersal, which may limit them from recovering naturally. Researchers learned from the Fern Lake Fire that willow communities in Moraine Park did not recover to their past extent. To expedite willow and wetland recovery, the park is currently planning on actively planting in the wetlands of Moraine Park and Upper Beaver Meadows. Limber pine recovery is heavily dependent on Clark's nutcrackers dispersing and caching seeds in the burned area. This seed dispersal requires mature live trees located adjacent to burned areas. Due to recent reductions in limber pine populations from mountain pine beetle, non-native fungal pathogen that causes white pine blister rust, limber pine dwarf mistletoe, and climate change, only small areas of the fire have adjacent live stands of limber pine. To assist in the recovery of limber pine, the park is planning on growing out seedlings and planting them in burned areas. — Scott Esser, Director of the RMNP Continental Divide Research Learning Center

Simulated Beaver Structures May Help Restore Riparian Communities in Rocky

Planting new willows and building fences to keep out hungry elk and moose has been an effective strategy to preserve and restore some of the willow communities within the park, but it's become clear that the historically shortened willows in some areas are not growing back to their previous height.

The Rocky Mountains are known for their fast-moving rivers meandering down wide, open valleys. These valleys provide sweeping views of grassy meadows from the valley wall to the river's edge. Ironically, although this is an iconic image, some of these characteristics are actually signs of an unhealthy ecosystem. Historically, these mountain rivers were not meandering within a grassy meadow, but instead, lazily moving from one beaver pond down to the next within a mosaic of tall willows. ponds, multi-thread channels and wetlands. These tall willows, ponds and wetlands are the park's largest source of biodiversity and they are home to many fish, amphibians, mammals, birds and insects. Once one sees what these systems could look like, the existing bucolic scene loses much of its appeal. And more and more, an important missing link to this former diverse landscape is becoming clear: the beaver.

Chicken or the Egg?

Beavers are integral to wetland and riparian ecosystems, as we've seen in Yellowstone's famous ecosystem recovery story, and once the beavers come back, the system quickly starts to recover. Rocky Mountain National Park is not without beavers. They come into the park every summer, but they rarely set up camp and stay. The problem is a lack of willows, their primary food source. Beavers can't maintain sustainable populations without a large number of willows for food and to provide building supplies.

Willows are specially adapted for life with beavers. Beavers can chew off a stem, jam it into a dam or lodge, and that stem will grow roots. Soon, a new willow shrub will begin to develop. Willow seeds are made to germinate on wet, bare soil, just the type of soil that is exposed before beavers rebuild their dams after the spring runoff. Here's where the story gets complicated, because in Rocky, the large, hungry moose and elk that have no natural predators to mitigate their numbers, have kept willows from growing big and tall, limiting the willow's potential to serve as either food or building material.

If the beavers need the willows, and the willows need the beavers, what's a national park to do?

Uncertainties about restoring RMNP Willow Floodplains

Planting new willows and building fences to keep out hungry elk and

moose has been an effective strategy to preserve and restore some of the willow communities within the park, but it's become clear that the historically shortened willows in some areas are not growing back to their previous height. And without that growth, there is too little food and building supplies for the beavers. Digging deeper, what is it, then, that is limiting willow growth? How can we help these systems to increase that growth, potentially leading to beavers in the future?

Based on previous studies of meadow soils in Rocky Mountain National Park, we know that beaver dams and ponds, prior to European settlement, kept meadow groundwater levels high, providing easily accessible water to willows throughout the summer. In many of these same areas today, the streambed is eroded by more than three feet below the riverbank, and groundwater is rarely observed near the ground surface, especially later in the summer when willows need water most. Is the lack of beaver dams causing low groundwater levels? Could this lack of high groundwater be limiting willow growth? Is it possible to mimic beaver dams?

Incorporating Science into Ecosystem Management

Rocky Mountain National Park, the National Park Service Inventory and Monitoring Network, and Colorado State University, with support from the Rocky Mountain Conservancy, are all collaborating to answer these questions through a series of simulated beaver structures (SBS). Designed to test whether willows are limited by low water levels, the SBS act like beaver dams, raising the water within the channel, which should then raise the groundwater levels in the adjacent floodplain.

Prior to the installation of the SBS, the project team monitored water levels within the channel and underground in the floodplain, as well as water movement between the channel and the floodplain, plant species composition within the floodplain, and annual willow growth. These measurements will all continue to be collected for the years following the SBS installation to see if water levels and willow growth increase.

Five simulated beaver structures were built in 2019 and 2020. Building these structures took an incredible amount of coordination and teamwork, particularly with the challenges of COVID-19. The project team was ecstatic to see immediate increases in the water levels behind the structures and will continue collecting data on water and willows. Although we have seen preliminary evidence of success, we also know that beavers are much better at maintaining real beaver dams than are humans. With this in mind, our team's immediate goal is to figure out how we can restore a sustainable willow community to maintain a healthy population of beavers. The long-term goal is that the beavers will ultimately finish the restoration of Rocky's meadows to the magical mosaics that sustain a healthy riparian ecosystem.

The project team will continue to monitor groundwater levels, floodplain and channel interactions, plant species composition, and annual willow growth during the next two years to determine if these areas are restoring better than areas without simulated beaver structures. Look for future articles from the Rocky Mountain Conservancy about the progress of this research project.

Cascade Cottages Listed in the National Register of Historic Places

Cascade Cottages National Register **Nomination Notes**

The Cascade Dam and subsequent Cascade Lake was part of the Stanley Power Company's facilities. The infrastructure carried water from Cascade Lake through a wooden pipeline to the hydro plant. The original dam was destroyed by the Lawn Lake flood in 1982; the remains of a concrete diversion structure on the property date to 1988.

Mr. McWilliams spoke with the Davis family to learn that several foreign exchange students who stayed at Cascade Cottages in the 1950s helped build some of the cabins. These individuals, who became like family, hailed from Mexico, France, Pakistan, Chile and Nigeria.

The "hump" in the middle of the property is called Reindeer Hill.

On August 27, 2020, the Keeper of the National Register entered the Cascade Cottages Historic District in the National Register of Historic Places. The Rocky Mountain Conservancy provided funding for the nomination, which was prepared by Carl McWilliams, of Cultural Resource Historians, LLC. The property is located along Fall River Road, approximately 4 miles inside the Fall River Entrance on the south side of the road. In 2016, after nearly two years of negotiations, the property was initially sold to the Trust for Public Lands (TPL). Significant funds for this purchase were also provided by the Conservancy, the Larimer County Open Lands Program, the Estes Valley Land Trust, and the Town of Estes Park. In 2017, TPL conveyed the property to the National Park Service.

The use of the property as a resort started with the Cascade Lodge, which had around twenty sleeping rooms, a lobby, dining room, and kitchen. The lodge was completed in 1925 and burned to the ground on June 12, 1935. After the fire, owner Anna May Derby built nine summer cabins before her death in 1941. L. V. and Hazel Davis purchased the property in 1943. Between 1946 and 1960, they constructed seven additional cabins

and demolished two earlier cabins. Teachers by trade, L.V. and Hazel did much of the building and renovating themselves, with the help of friends and family. Two more generations of Davises helped run the summer business until 2016.

According to McWilliams, the property was the "longest-tenured inholding and privately-run tourist facility within Rocky Mountain National Park." McWilliams speculates that "a key to Cascade Cottages' longevity was that its owners succeeded in operating a trouble-free business and in cultivating a positive relationship with the park's administrators. Largely as a result, the cottages endured through periods when numerous other inholdings were purchased by the park with their buildings ultimately razed to return the land to a more natural setting. Although informal discussions occasionally took place, neither the Cascade Cottages' owners or park management seriously pursued an exchange of ownership until recent years. And so, Cascade Cottages endured, and thus represents the best possible positive relationship between public and private entities."

Firmly Rooted in the Past: The Shadow Mountain Fire Lookout




The Shadow Mountain Fire Lookout is located high above the shores of Grand Lake and at 9,923 feet in elevation. After the steep and five-mile long hike, hearty trekkers arriving at the building might be disappointed to find the third story balcony closed to access. The balcony is unsafe; its log supports rotting. The park is partnering with the Rocky Mountain Conservancy to develop a plan for repairs.

Arguably the park's most handsome rustic-style building, the Shadow Mountain Fire Lookout dates to the Civilian Conservation Corps era when builders procured materials on site and the building appears to grow from the rocks upon which it is built. The third story is a large wood frame with windows on all four sides, surrounded by an exterior balcony and topped with a pyramid roof. It was listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 1978.

To start the investigation into repairs, a team of park and Conservancy staff and board members decided on four equal project goals: safety, accessibility, sustainability and history (read the full "desired future conditions" in featured sidebar). Next, the Conservancy hired Anderson Hallas Architects, a Denverbased architectural and engineering firm, to conduct an Historic Structures Assessment (HSA). The HSA provides documentary, graphic and physical information about a property's history and existing condition.

Anderson Hallas visited the building twice in 2020 to conduct physical investigations. They determined the cause of the balcony's structural



failure, tested mortar and wood, and assessed the condition of every feature of the building from the roof to the foundation. Anderson Hallas also helped the park and Conservancy team develop a program for the re-use of the property, and created detailed measured drawings to inform future preservation work. When delivered in spring of 2021, the resulting Historic Structures Report will serve as an important guide for all changes made to a historic property during future projects, direct maintenance procedures, as well as recording the findings of the research and investigation.



Desired Future Condition of Shadow Mountain Fire Lookout

Designed and built by Rocky Mountain National Park in 1932–1933, Shadow Mountain Fire Lookout is an exemplary rustic-style building, "the happy results where a masonry structure can appear to grow out of a natural rock outcrop" (Albert Good, Park and Recreation Structures, 1938). The last remaining fire tower in the park, its strategic location is a destination for hikers who are rewarded with tree top views of Grand Lake below and the Grand Valley beyond.

The site resonates a sense of place and provides a unique visitor experience. The building itself is firmly rooted in the past — a one of a kind design built by skilled craftsmen — that sits in a landscape that has changed over time. It is a tangible link to the park's evolving fire management philosophy and the evolution of the forest itself.

Here we have the opportunity for stewardship, education and function to reconnect. We will maintain the multi-generational connections forged in this place, for park staff, visitors, and residents of Grand County. This project will provide a unique and rich visitor experience while still allowing the structure to be used for its original purpose in fire protection for the park and the greater Grand Lake community. We will marry safety, accessibility, sustainability, and history to assure this place remains a point of pride for future generations.

Students Partner with Conservancy to Create Project Map for Website

Passionate visitors, speaking out and donating, are responsible for more than half of the projects completed to date. Perhaps you've had a chance to look at the Rocky Mountain Conservancy website of late? If so, you may have engaged with a newly featured interactive map now positioned on our philanthropy page.

Last summer, Roberta Farrington and Kristen Brinkley from Colorado State University's Master's of Conservation Leadership program partnered with the Rocky Mountain Conservancy for their summer capstone project. The goal was to increase community engagement through improved website design and communication.

Success was measured through three objectives:

• Educate Rocky Mountain Conservancy supporters of all 54 Conservancy projects since 1985 through a multi-layer, interactive map that features the title, date, photo, description, amount funded, partners, and legacy of the project on the RMC website.

Outcome: Using ArcGIS software, the final product is featured on the Conservancy website under the "Our Impact" tab of the "Our Projects" page (www. rmconservancy.org/our-impact).

 Engage visitors on the RMC website to see a 30% increase in time a user spends on the project page.

Outcome: Utilizing Google Analytics, the amount of time visitors spend on project-related pages and the number of page visits was tracked. Results showed a 60% increase in total page views and a 376% increase in average time spent on the page.

 Receive at least 20 popup survey responses and host at least 2 focusgroups to gather feedback on the impact and effectiveness of the interactive web-map feature.

Outcome: After receiving 32 survey responses, results showed that 85% of respondents felt more likely to donate to the RMC after exploring the interactive map. Feedback from two focus groups revealed strengths of the map and ways to improve in the future.

Their project furthers the Conservancy's mission to promote stewardship of Rocky Mountain National Park through education and philanthropy. Be sure to check out the map on the Conservancy website to see for yourself!

Impact Map Fun Facts

If you look closely, you will notice that the Conservancy completed its first park project in 1985 despite being founded in 1931.

During the first 54 years, the nonprofit focused solely on producing educational materials, interpretation programs, and research. It wasn't until the Conservancy hired its first executive director in 1985 that they expanded their mission to include philanthropy.

The Conservancy built its donor base from passionate park visitors who frequented Rocky Mountain National Park, witnessed places for improvement, voiced its ideas to the executive director, and was willing to fund the projects. Passionate visitors, speaking out and donating, are responsible for more than half of the projects completed to date.

Thanks to a growing group dedicated to RMNP, we are all able to continue to enjoy the beauty of the park in fun and educational ways. Don't underestimate the power of your experiences and your voice — this is, in fact, how the Conservancy has accomplished so much in Rocky and in surrounding Forest Service areas.

systems and seed stores, and new shoots of vegetation might appear just weeks after the burn. In the case of the East Troublesome Fire, which expanded from 19,000 to 125,000 acres in just 12 hours, pushed by 60 mile-per-hour winds, there might be large areas of intact soils because the fire passed through so quickly.

Forest fires thus leave behind a mosaic of unburned areas and areas with a range of fire disturbance depending on burn intensity. This in turn leads to a patchwork of plant communities in various stages of ecological succession, a term that ecologists use to describe the progression or change of plant communities over time following a disturbance, such as fire, in an area. Therefore, forest fires typically produce a landscape with much greater plant community diversity than previously existed, especially if the previous landscape was unburned for a century or more. This means that there will be a higher diversity of plant as well as animal species. Thus, it is often said that fires rejuvenate a landscape.

A few decades ago, ecologists might have been speculating on how long the process of ecological succession would take to return burned ecosystems in places like Rocky Mountain National Park to their former composition. That sort of discussion has been turned on its head by our recognition that climate change is real and is having significant impact on our mountain ecosystems. We have no evidence that climate change will be slowing down anytime soon, and the records of 2020 are likely to be broken in

the coming years. As the climate changes, so do the conditions that favor the establishment of one plant species over another. Thus, we can expect that a changing climate will steer ecological succession in a different direction, favoring plant species that are more tolerant of drought conditions and warmer temperatures than previous species.

One of the concerns about wildfires revolves around the impact of the fire on wildlife. Both the Cameron Peak and East Troublesome fires occurred late in the season. The Cameron Peak fire started during late summer and the East Troublesome fire started in mid-October, and both burned through November. The timing of the fires put them well after the breeding season of most bird and wildlife species. Juveniles were able to disperse or at least achieve sufficient mobility to avoid most of the burning areas. While many animals were undoubtedly lost in the rapidly moving East Troublesome Fire, the main impact of the wildfires will be the loss of breeding habitat for birds, and loss of food and shelter for other wildlife. species. Burned areas will likely be avoided by most wildlife until sufficient vegetative recovery takes place, though tender grass and forb shoots will be sought by herbivores during the recovery.

Burned areas often attract species that otherwise would not be in great abundance. For example, trees killed by fire but left standing are often invaded by bark beetles. The beetles in turn provide food for woodpeckers and nuthatches. Recently burned areas are good places to look for American three-toed woodpeckers, which tend to concentrate in these areas for feeding. These woodpeckers breed in mature conifer forests but are typically uncommon.

The intense fires of 2020 in the park were a symptom of our changing climate, much as the mountain pine beetle outbreak was during the past couple of decades. But these fires and others likely to follow will not materially change Rocky. The mountains will still be there, and the signature forest types that are familiar to us will remain. But ecosystems are dynamic, and they respond to changes in climate. As winter conditions become shorter and warmer, and the summer growing season becomes longer and drier, subtle changes will occur. Drought intolerant plants will colonize higher elevations, or more north-facing exposures. Species that are part of existing plant communities might increase or decrease their relative proportion depending on their tolerance for warmer temperatures. Wildfires might accelerate this process in some ways, but the process will occur with or without wildfires. From a broader perspective, it can be helpful to appreciate the dynamic nature of our landscape, and that we are witnessing only a brief moment in its evolution.

Park Puzzler Solution



Alluvial Fan Restoration Completed

If you miss visiting the Alluvial Fan, you're not alone. After several months of construction closures, the new-and-improved accessible trail opened on September 25, 2020!

The Alluvial Fan was formed in 1982 when an earthen dam located at Lawn Lake breached, causing a devastating flood. The sound of water roaring downhill was so intense a maintenance worker at the Rainbow Curve overlook on Trail Ridge Road thought a plane had crashed. Floodwaters stripped the vegetation from the landscape, leaving behind a boulder field and loads of sediment.

With beautiful water cascades and views of the Fall River Valley, the newly formed Alluvial Fan quickly gained popularity with park visitors. An asphalt trail and pedestrian bridge were built in 1985, which improved access to the area. However, in 2013 another flood destroyed this trail when between 12 and 14 inches of rain fell in 24 hours.

Park Service employees Doug Parker, trails program supervisor, and Jesse Miller, project manager, know the devastation caused by the 2013 flood better than most. "Doug and I were actually camping up at the Lawn Lake Cabin during the flood," said Miller, "and it was a scary experience. Hiking down, the best I can equate it to is it sounded like a bowling alley – just giant boulders crashing into each other, trees coming down, the trail was a river."

Once the chaos of the flood settled, the extent of the damage became clear. The trail was washed out entirely in some areas and broken to bits in others. The west side of the Alluvial Fan had become a boulder field. There was no trail, no bridge,

and no way this area could be considered accessible anymore.

"As a trail crew, we have 350 miles of trail to cover. We have priorities everywhere," said Parker, "but once we had a highly visited, popular, accessible trail get decimated in the flood – it totally reprioritized what we were doing."

The story of restoring this area began with an environmental assessment in 2013 to determine how best to realign the trail to improve access for all users. In 2017, the trail crew began researching accessibility standards, and an outside contractor, an expert in outdoor accessibility, designed a trail system that would universally benefit visitors.

In the spring of 2019, Rocky received final plans and began construction.

Each decision was made with easeof-use and sustainability in mind. FilterPave was used to pave the nearly 2,000 feet of trail because the hardened tread surface is firm enough for wheelchair users but is also porous, allowing water to run through. This is the first trail in Rocky built with this material, which is an improvement over the commonly used crushed granite that struggles to handle heavy snow loads, wind and flooding. Even the placement of rocks along the trail is intentional, with some set higher to provide places to sit and rest while enjoying the view.

In the beginning, ten crew members worked at the site daily. This number rose to 25 during the final month of construction, as an eagerness to finish the project grew. Additionally, five Rocky Mountain Conservancy Conservation Corps members worked with the Park Service staff for three weeks. "It couldn't have been





done without them," noted Miller. Parker agreed, "[the Conservancy's] involvement has been huge on this, from labor to funding."

Thoughtfully constructed, this trail allows all visitors to enjoy breathtaking views of the Mummy Range, Horseshoe Falls, and Endovalley. A fully accessible trail leaves the West Alluvial Fan parking and picnic area and meanders up to a 56-foot bridge that crosses the Roaring River. On the east side of the bridge, visitors can turn north to an overlook area with views of Horseshoe Falls or continue to the East Alluvial Fan parking area.

"My parents are coming into town from Ohio this weekend," said Parker. "I was so pumped. This has saved the annual quandary of 'Where do I take my parents?' They're going to love it."

Built sustainably, with flooding in mind, and accessible to all, this trail is here to stay. We think you'll love it, too.

While the world is in chaos, we look to nature for grounding and renewal — and Rocky Mountain National Park has plenty to offer • Conservancy Member Steve Coles relayed the story of some of his friends that live in the town of Raymond, Colorado, who were awakened at 2 AM to a ruckous occuring near their house. They peered outside and saw a mountain lion that had a grip on the throat of a mule deer right outside the windows on their patio. The lion was thrashing the deer around, but their appearance startled it and the lion took off — the deer wandered away, apparently not in grave standing Conservancy member Marlene Borneman was struck by how just weeks after returning home from the fire evacuation she noticed an unusual number of large birds around their home, including ravens, Clark's nutcrackers, stellars jays, hairy woodpeckers and yellow-shafted flickers — not the usual collection of small birds that frequent their feeders • On a trip to Grand Lake, Marlene and Conservancy member Walt Borneman found some bright spots in Rocky amidst the destruction the Troublesome Fire had wrought. The Timber Lake Trail was as beautiful as ever, especially in winter, with lovely sunrises and sunsets on the Never Summer Range, and snow on the ground that will water new plant growth • Additionally, while hiking along the Finch Lake Trail in November, Marlene spotted and followed delicate, tiny deer mouse tracks in the snow for about a mile — but she did not see the mouse • Walt also observed quite a few pikas early in December, all fluffed and furry, running around in the snow along the Flattop Trail, atop Hallett, and in the Boulderfield • Park Interpreter

Kathy Brazelton gets pretty excited about the word *subnivean* — *below* the *snow* is a fascinating world! She's been finding a lot of vole tunnels of late and evidence of the complicated society that exists in the subnivean terrain. There are highways, kitchens, bedrooms and even toilets under the snow. Although appearing barren on the surface, life goes on in this sheltered environment, enabling voles, mice, the occasional grouse and the predatory weasel to survive the cold temperatures of winter • RMNP Woodcrafter Cory Johnson reported seeing a great-horned owl swoop down about 50' in front of him on his walk to work in the park's utility area one early morning in January. It skimmed a few feet above the ground across the meadow, perhaps in search of its next meal • In December, Cory was in Moraine Park after the East Troublesome Fire where he saw a healthy bobcat feeding on a very fresh deer carcass near the road. He thought it unlikely that the bobcat killed the deer, but then again, he'd never seen one feeding on a carcass before. The entire carcass was gone/scattered just a couple hours later when he passed by again Conservancy member David Kempkes was driving through the park in early January in hopes of photographing one of the many animals that live in Rocky. After spending hours in the park with no luck, he headed home, but just past the Beaver Meadows Entrance he spotted a huge bird fighting among throngs of magpies and ravens. Lying in the grass was a deer carcass that most likely had been hit by a car, based on its proximity to the road. Over it was an intense flurry of hungry birds. Dave suspected the large bird was a golden eagle based on its impressive size, but



he'd never seen one this close. He was able to get some photos before it flew to a nearby tree, which allowed about 15 magpies to move in and resume their feast. Meanwhile, a wave of ravens moved in for their turn. Dave went back early the next morning and waited as a covote took its turn on what was now a well-consumed carcass. At a return trip in the afternoon, the carcass was completely consumed • Conservancy members Andy and Rachel Ames were excited to see a bobcat making a scrape outside their home one evening in December. The next day, they spotted not one but four bobcats at the site — a mother with three kittens. It appeared a young deer had been killed and the bobcats were having a feast. Over the course of the day they watched as all four got fatter and fatter. When they paused to take a break, mama laid close to the kill to keep scavengers away • Keep your eyes peeled when you next visit Rocky, and share your Nature Notes
